Dear Prime Minister Trudeau and Justice Minister Lametti:

Re: Upcoming Ontario vacancies - Supreme Court of Canada

We write to you as organizations that advocate for the rights and interests of Indigenous people and Black, racialized, women's, disability, low income and other equality seeking groups in Canada.

We are aware that two Ontario vacancies at the Supreme Court of Canada will need to be filled in the next 18 months: Justice Abella retires July 1, 2021 and Justice Moldaver retires December 23, 2022. Given that our highest court remains all white, and in view of the many pressing legal issues implicating the rights of Indigenous people and Black, racialized and other marginalized groups within Canadian society, it is time to fill both positions with members who are representative of these communities.

The Supreme Court requires not only in-depth knowledge of Indigenous and substantive equality law, but judges with expertise grounded in lived experience, and the legitimacy that comes with a bench that is more representative of the diversity of our country. As Chief Justice Wagner recently expressed it: "There is a growing awareness of the need for our courts, including our highest court, to reflect the diversity of Canadians."

Over the next months, the signatories to this letter will be sending you the names of highly qualified candidates for the upcoming Ontario vacancies. As you will see, there is no shortage of brilliant and experienced lawyers, both women and men, who are Indigenous or from Black, racialized and other equality seeking communities, who can serve our country with distinction on its highest court. In these circumstances, the appointment of a person who is not a member of these communities would bear a very heavy burden of justification. We urge you to reach out to the highly qualified candidates we recommend for the upcoming Supreme Court vacancies and for any judicial appointments you may make in future.
